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Notes on Completing the Program of Study

When completing the Program of Study, please indicate the year a course was taken under the appropriate semester it was taken.

3. Beginning in the second year, students will participate in the Advanced Counseling Practicum. The practicum in the first and second year are full year courses with one credit taken in the fall and two credits taken in the spring. Please indicate each semester on the Program of Study. The practicum in the third year is optional for students who began their program prior to the 2023 - 2024 academic year. Please note previously the practicum in the first and second year were both taken under APSY 9846 and the third year practicum was APSY8742.

- I will take two graduate level courses and have a full time assistantship for two consecutive semesters (fall and spring) in the academic year
