

THEO2160/PHIL1160 The Challenge of Justice

This course introduces the student to the principal understandings of justice that have developed in the Western philosophical and theological traditions. Care is taken to relate the theories to concrete, practical and political problems, and to develop good reasons for choosing one way of justice rather than another. The relationship of justice to the complementary notion of peace will also be examined. Special attention is paid to the contribution of Catholic theology in the contemporary public conversations about justice and peace. Problems discussed may include human rights, hunger and poverty, and ecological justice.
