CONTEMPORARY IRISH CULTURE

This three-week, three-credit course is open to any and all students who wish to visit and learn about Ireland. Students travel as a group to Galway, Belfast and Dublin and are accompanied at all times by a BC-Ireland faculty or staff member. Lectures are given by members of the BC Irish Studies faculty and leading scholars from the Irish universities. Students will experience and learn about different aspects of regional culture: Irish film, traditional and contemporary Irish music, politics and the Troubles in Northern Ireland, as well as ancient traditions, drama, literature, sport and tourism.

Several day trips are scheduled, including to the Aran Islands, County Clare, Newgrange in County Meath, the Murals and cityscape of Belfast, Abbey Theatre in Dublin, the National Gallery of Ireland and the Guinness Storehouse. There is also free time for private study, shopping and exploration.

SOCIAL PROGRAMME

Regularly scheduled events are part of the summer studies programme including nights at traditional music venues, evenings in the pub, walking tours, of literary and historic Dublin, water cruises and visits to the theatre. Students will also have many opportunities to socialise with the large community of BC alumni who live and work in Ireland.

Estimated Costs:

Fees: Approx. \$4500

Other Expenses: \$900
(student responsibility)

Includes: Tuition, in-country travel, accommodation, breakfast, welcome/farewell dinner, use of BC-Ireland facilities.

Does not include: Travel to and from Ireland, personal expenses such as personal travel.

Eligibility:

All majors, especially students interested in Irish and European studies, political science, history, business and the arts.

Length of Program:

3 weeks

Credit: 3 course credits
(Minor in Irish Studies)
