Message from the Director



Dear Students,

I hope this message finds you well. For this newsletter, I want to highlight our [summer 2025 faculty-led programs and internships](#) for students. Both are excellent ways to spend part of your summer abroad. I encourage all students to review our [program offerings](#) and apply by February 5, 2025. Summer programs are a great opportunity for students looking to supplement junior year study abroad, for STEM students, athletes, or anyone hoping to complete degree requirements abroad but cannot spend extended time away from BC during the academic year; there is no GPA requirement for summer programs.

Students who applied for a semester or academic year program will be notified of their program and status in early to mid-February. Students should carefully review their notifications and be prepared to proceed with any instructions, particularly regarding fall or full-year programs.

This is an important reminder that now is a good time to review eligibility requirements and deadlines for various [summer, semester, and year 2025-26 scholarship and grant opportunities](#), submit applications, and/or [schedule appointments](#) as needed.

For first-year students and students who missed this year's [semester study abroad deadline](#), our office will begin advising for semester abroad programs again in April. Please stay tuned for more information later this semester.

Summer Study Abroad 2025 Deadline

Final call for summer 2025 applications. Some classes are already filled and have waitlists. However many courses are still accepting applications. The application deadline for BC summer faculty-led programs and internships abroad is Feb. 5, 2025. Students are accepted on a rolling basis until spots are filled. You can find more summer information on the OGE website.

What's next? Admitted students will need to confirm their participation by February 20. This saves your place in the program. In early March OGE will confirm or "green-light" the programs. You can purchase your airline ticket in early March after receiving the program confirmation email. Pre-departure meetings will be held in April.

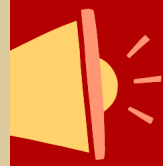

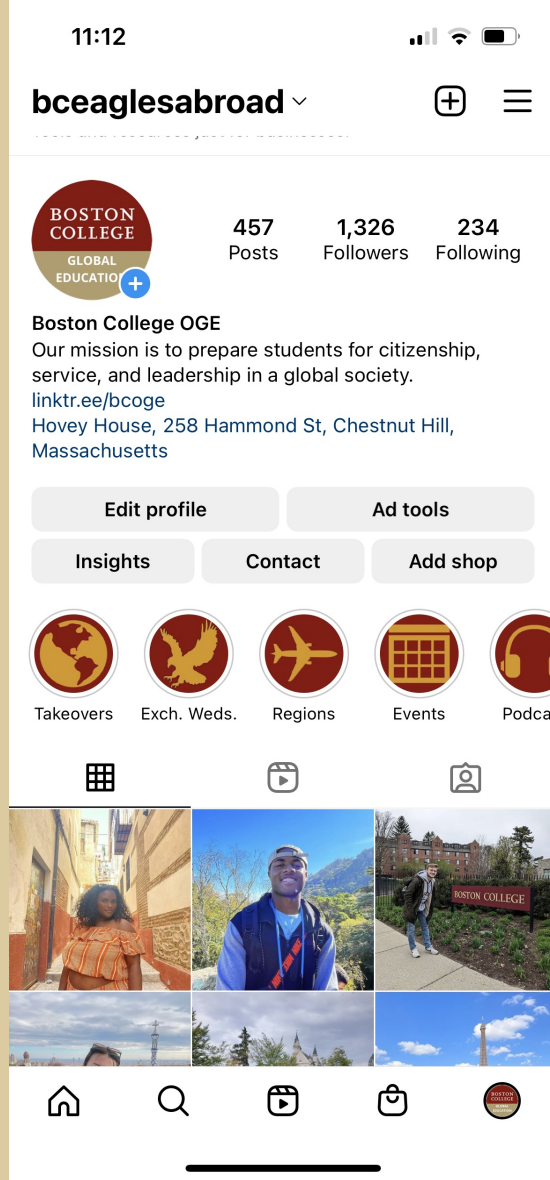
