Learning Outcomes Office of the Dean of Students

Students who engage with the **Office of the Dean of Students** at Boston College will be able to:

| I | Identify strategies to persist through and make meaning out of adversity. |
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| 2 | Understand their rights and responsibilities as students and community members. |
| 3 | Explain how to file an incident report to document students of concern, campus accessibility issues, and/or an alleged violation of the Student Code of Conduct. |
| 4 | Advocate for their needs, request accommodations, and know how to access them. |
| 5 | Understand the mission of the Office of the Dean of Students in the context of the Jesuit tradition, fostering a community of care, support, and advocacy. |

Learning Outcomes Student Conduct System

Students who have participated in the **Student Conduct System** at Boston College will be able to:

| I | Identify how individual behavior impacts the larger community. |
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| 2 | Recognize the consequences of their behavior. |
| 3 | Understand that sanctions will be more severe for future policy violations. |
| 4 | Understand that future policy violations may impact their goals at Boston College and beyond (i.e., study abroad, student employment, student leadership positions, medical and law school applications, etc.). |
| 5 | Understand how decision-making before the incident could have improved the outcome and integrate this understanding into their future behavior. |
| 6 | Recognize the importance of, and be able to identify, a campus resource or support person to assist them in the future. |

Learning Outcomes Disability Services

Students who have interacted with **Disability Services** at Boston College will be able to:

| I | Identify disability services as a resource and understand their available services and accommodations. |
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| 2 | Register for disability-related accommodations. |
| 3 | Demonstrate how to utilize their accommodations. |
| 4 | Advocate for their own accommodation needs. |

Learning Outcomes Off-Campus Student Living

Students who have interacted with **Off-Campus Student Living** at Boston College will be able to:

| I | Define their rights and responsibilities as tenants and neighbors. |
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| 2 | Negotiate shared household responsibilities within their apartment. |
| 3 | Describe community service opportunities available to them. |
| 4 | Navigate listings and resources on the University's apartment database. |
| 5 | Identify government and Boston College tenant support resources. |
| 6 | Advocate for their needs as tenants. |

Learning Outcomes Student Support/Case Management

Students who have interacted with **Student Support/Case Mgmt** at Boston College will be able to:

| I | Identify on and off-campus support and resources. |
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| 2 | Understand how and why they would access support and resources. |
| 3 | Report feeling more comfortable accessing support and resources. |
| 4 | Identify people and places in their lives that are supportive of them. |

| 3 | Advocate for positive change among their peers. |
| 4 | Recognize the value of volunteerism and service within the community. |
| 5 | Name the Boston College office responsible for organizing the Breakfast Club. |

Learning Outcomes Community Connections

Students who have participated in **Community Connections** will be able to:

| I | Communicate key policies of Boston College and the City of Boston that significantly impact students living off-campus. |
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| 2 | Demonstrate an understanding of the historical relationship between the student rental property and their neighboring properties. |
| 3 | Identify Boston College and City of Boston resources that can assist them while they are off campus. |
| 4 | Articulate an understanding of how incidents are reported, documented, and adjudicated by Boston College and the City of Boston. |

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| 2 | Name functions, resources, and services of the Office of the Dean of Students. |
| 3 | Understand the different perspectives, experiences, and identities of classmates. |
| 4 | Advocate for changes or improvements to student life at Boston College. |
| 5 | Explain how they could utilize DOS for assistance in the future. |

Learning Outcomes BCaring Campaign

Students who have participated in **BCaring Campaign** will be able to:

| Ι | Demonstrate a shared understanding of the Jesuit legacy of "people for others" by articulating how choices impact the greater community. |
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| 2 | Seek appropriate help for classmates in need of emergency assistance. |
| 3 | Exhibit consistent values and choices, regardless of time or place. |
| 4 | Demonstrate respect for frontline and facilities staff at all athletic events. |
