Assessing the Impact of Early Life Trauma on Violent Offenders: Implications for Pretrial Mental Health and Restorative Justices.

The primary goal of this study is to assess violence exposure and trauma-related symptoms among individuals incarcerated for violent offenses to highlight the need for pretrial mental health assessments and the implementation of tailored Restorative Justice programs. By understanding these trauma-related issues, the study aims to inform targeted interventions that could reduce incarceration rates and support the rehabilitation of this vulnerable population.

Triggered Life.

The Triggered Life project uses art as a method and medium to support mental health practitioners in understanding the raw uncensored truths of Black and Brown men's experience of trauma.
