Safety guidelines when using William:

- Please make sure to <u>stay away</u> from the silver nitrogen and helium transfer lines that are under vacuum.
- Sample tubes need to be shorter than the red lever (which should never be touched!) on the sample case (please see me if you are unfamiliar).
- If your sample has just been ejected, please use the <u>blue button</u> to move it away from the sample transfer path before attempting to remove it (again, please see me if you are unfamiliar).
- Green lights on the sample case and line indicate all systems are working; blinking lights indicate a sample transfer in process; red lights and alarms indicate a problem (please email the MRC staff in case of the latter).
- Do NOT remotely change the name or location of your experiment folder if it
 has already been submitted; this would cause the queue to STOP!

Etiquette rules to follow when using the autosampler:

- Please sign in/out of the logbook when you use the system; there is no need for iLab reservations—<u>UNLESS</u> you plan on running overnight (10 pm to 8 am) experiments, in which case you <u>MUST</u> to make a reservation on iLab so that other users are aware.
- 2. During the day, please limit an individual experiment time to a maximum of 30 minutes; see me in the case of an urgent need. This rule is relaxed on Sundays.
- 3. Do **NOT** schedule experiments during the day; this should only be done if you are setting up an experiment to run overnight.
- 4. If you need to remove a sample to make room for your own, please check the carousel in IconNMR: yellow spaces can be used, pink spaces indicate queued experiments, so PLEASE DO NOT REMOVE!
- 5. Samples that are removed should be carefully placed in the conveniently numbered rack on the stool next to the sample case.
- 6. Please make sure to meet with staff and demonstrate your proficiency with the software after you have been trained by your mentor, <u>before you use the</u> system unsupervised.
