FOREIGN NATIONAL VISITING SCHOLAR EXPORT CONTROL FORM

Parts I, II & III on this form must be completed and signed by the Faculty or Staff Member sponsoring a Foreign National Visiting Scholar Applicant

Under U.S. law, the transfer or release of export-controlled technology, technical data or source code to a foreign national is "deemed" to be an export to that foreign national's country of citizenship and/or permanent residence. This "deemed" export can occur even if the foreign national is legally in the U.S. and working, researching or studying at a university. Unless an authorized license exemption or exception applies, the sharing of export-controlled items and technology requires an export license issued by the U.S. Government.

This form provides the required information to determine whether a Foreign National Visiting Scholar at Boston College will be exposed to any export-controlled items or technology, and if so, whether an export license is required and/or the Foreign National Visiting Scholar's access will be limited by a Technology Control Plan (TCP).
