

## A MESSAGE FROM THE ASSISTANT DEAN




I am delighted to share with you the following report on the EY Peer Advisors and the many ways these students contribute to the Carroll School of Management. From the start, they have been a tremendous resource to the Carroll School and each year their impact grows as they reach more students and find innovative new ways to support their peers.

Located in the Carroll School's undergraduate programs office, our advising staff has three full-time academic advisors and two full-time career advisors serving more than 2,000 undergraduates. The EY Peer Advisors act as an extension of our team, helping us to provide a range of services and support to all students.

The core of the EY Peer Advisor program is their weekly drop-in hours, during which they advise students on a range of academic and career concerns. On the academic side, the EY Peer Advisors help students select courses, learn about concentration options, and explore study abroad opportunities. For career advising, they help students with resume critiques, researching various career fields, and preparing for interviews.

In addition to individual advising sessions, the EY Peer Advisors work together to present several information programs throughout the year, including:

- Study Abroad Info Session
- Concentrations Day
- How to Get the Job Offer







This past year, they also worked as teaching assistants for the Sophomore Accelerator course, leading classroom presentations on the internship experience and helping students create resumes and cover letters. Feedback has been positive from the Sophomore Accelerator instructors, who said they were incredibly grateful to the EY Peer Advisors for their assistance.

One of the best parts of this program is that they provide their peers with the one thing we don't have—the student experience. Whether it be course registration, study abroad, or the internship search, none of our staff can provide the firsthand experience and insight that the advisors bring to their work. I regularly hear from students how much they appreciate working with an EY Peer Advisor.

For all these reasons and more, the EY Peer Advisors are an invaluable resource for our students, and they are essential to our advising program. 
